Thank you for sharing this information. Your concern is highly appreciated.

This is to notify you that the mail/offer with regard to a job opportunity at Wipro, is not a genuine one.

We have noticed that resumes in employment websites and job portals often receive offers of 'jobs' at Wipro that require payment of cash deposit into specified bank accounts. These are fake job offers because Wipro never seeks payment of money from candidates and no selection takes place without completion of the requisite interview processes.

As an organization, we have been taking necessary steps to educate prospective candidates (through newspapers, company website etc.) to ensure that such malpractices do not get opportunities to grow using names of organizations like Wipro.

In such cases, we have tried approaching cyber-crime cell on multiple occasions, however they refuse to acknowledge complaints as Wipro is not the direct impacted party in such cases. Cyber Crime Cell suggests that the victim should directly lodge a complaint with the Police.

Also, it becomes difficult to catch hold of such groups as they continuously keep changing their e-mail addresses, phone numbers and ways they operate such scams.

Please refrain from paying any amount as sought in the mail.

Some common attributes of these fake job offer emails are:
